WHEREAS, a brain aneurysm is the medical term for a bulging artery located in your brain; also known as cerebral aneurysm; and

WHEREAS, brain aneurysms are not harmful by themselves and can be detected before rupturing; and

WHEREAS, the prevalence of undiagnosed brain aneurysms is estimated to be 4% in the United States, which accounts for 12 million people at risk; and

WHEREAS, when a brain aneurysm ruptures, it causes serious health problems such as hemorrhagic stroke, brain damage, coma, and commonly death; and

WHEREAS, brain aneurysms are treatable and people have the ability to reduce their risk of having a brain aneurysm by maintaining a healthy blood pressure and avoiding tobacco and drug use; and

WHEREAS, symptoms of a brain aneurysm before it ruptures include: severe headache, neck pain, abnormal pupil dilation, double vision, and passing out; and

WHEREAS, risk factors of having a brain aneurysm include: smoking, high blood pressure or hypertension, family history, drug use, and traumatic head injury; and

WHEREAS, Brain Aneurysm Awareness Month is an opportunity to recognize and raise awareness of brain aneurysms to enhance the health and well-being of the residents of Florida.
